Application of life space investigation and essential evolutionary totality in case analysis (5marks)
- 5. **Evaluation of symptoms**: the concepts used in evaluation and its application adopted by Kent, Boger, and Boenninghausen., Dr. Hahnemann, Boenninghausen, Kent, Boger, Stuart Close, H A Robert, Garth Boericke and Bidwell.
- 6. Methodology of case taking in different types of cases like, acute, acute (Individual, Sporadic, Epidemic-Acute diseases with a Chronic background), Chronic (Mental diseases, intermittent with acute-exacerbation). Instructions given by Hahnemann in organon of medicine regarding case taking, analysis, anamnesis and catamensis of case. (7 marks)
- 7. **Practical applicability** of different repertories in interpreting presenting complaint, history of presenting complaint, past history,

family history, treatment history, obstetrical history, laboratory and other investigative procedures. Difficulties in taking chronic cases
